'WORKED ALL BRITAIN' AWARD

Sooner or later, the chap you are working will ask for your 'W.A.B. Area Number.' This refers to the 'Worked all Britain' award and the 'Area' is the 10KM National Grid square in which you are located. The number requested is made up of the two letters of the Major Grid Square, plus the lower co-ordinates of your 10KM square, as an example G3KPJ (West Hanningfield) is TQ 79. For most of the Chelmsford area stations the number would either be TL 60 or TL 70. Work yours out now and write it on the shack wall for future reference!

The basic award is for working 400 'Areas' (out of a possible 3790) and for QSO's after 1/1/70. QSL's will not be required as proof of contact so you can work them, happy in the knowledge that they wont even want you to send a card! All they need is a report, and your 'Area Number'.

Should the 'W.A.B.' bite you, details of the Award, Nets and Contests can be obtained from G3ABG, or locally from G3KPJ.

A point worthy of note. Any profit resulting from the award fee and sale of booklets, will go to the 'Radio Amateur Invalid and Bedrest Club' (RAIBC) to help provide receivers and other equipment for those who, through blindness or ill health, are unable to afford their own.
