The Radio Society of Great Britain have sent us a copy of their newsletter with regards to a provisional programme which will be held early in 1977 (May 6th-8th). In the main it will be an exhibition including HF/VHF Convention on the Saturday starting at 1300 to 1800 followed by a dinner at 1930. The venue has been booked at Alexandra Palace. (A lovely spot) There will be no VHF Convention later in the year.

I feel sure many of you will have heard from time to time an extra large signal on the twenty metre band, centred around 14200 kHz. This takes the form of a large squarewave pulse tone and sidebands covering 2MHz bandwidth. This signal has been beamed by a number of amateur stations in europe and Africa and the cross reference puts the source on the north coast of the Black Sea in the UB5 call area.

The RSGB intruder watch committee have been informed of the situation and we hope that not before too long it will have disappeared from the band.

Once again the meteor shower called the "Perseids" has passed, this took place over the period of the 10th-14th August. Activity was high and it appears more people are becoming interested in this form of communications, Keith G3WSN, had five complete QSO's via this phenomina. He worked UP2BBC (LP) SM2AID (LZ) SM2END (KZ) 0E5JKL (GI) and F6CJG (BF) and nearly worked SM2CFG (JX) on random.
