Next Meeting.

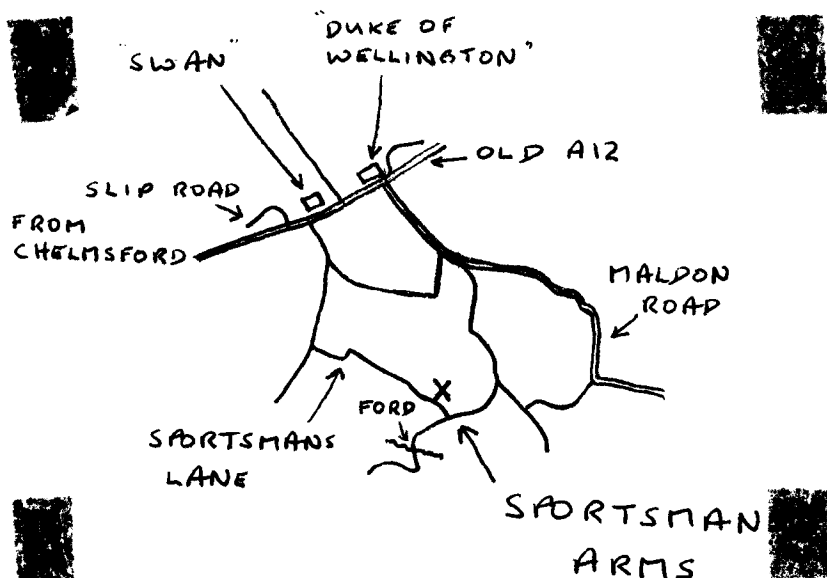
