DF - Part Two.

Chelmsford and Colchester National Qualifying Event. Sunday 10th May.

After 1 inch of rainfall the night before, the sun finally broke through the clouds onto the 21 teams assembled on Fordham Heath. The start was enlivened by two separate arrivals. First came a competitor from Mid-Thames who cruised regally around the site in his immaculately clean car (personalised numberplate) and parked in an advantageous position near the entrance. Later to arrive came Dorsen GSNMO, who turned off the road and almost immediately encountered a rather muddy patch of ground. She skillfully extricated her car, albeit with some wheelspin and spectacular shower of mud - and guess where that mud went? Renowned for his command of the English language, the owner of a new somewhat obscured numberplate was too astounded to speak.

From the start approx; half of the competitors headed for the 'A' station G3KPJ/P, who was hidden in thick gorse on Tiptree Heath. The lack of green cover was compensated by the erection of several dummy aerials in neighbouring trees which coupled signals from the main aerial and proved very misleading to some. One competitor spent rather a long time finding the transmitter and returned to find his car had one wheel sunk to the axle in mud! (He was towed out after tea).

The 'B' station, GLHKC/P, was concealed in a small wood on the NW bank of the Roman river at Rowhedge. This site also being close to the River Colne, several competitors found themselves on the 'wrong side' of the river, much to their inconvenience. The transmitter was hidden in a densely evergrown ditch and fed an aerial some 250 yds long.
