# REPORT ON LAST MONTHS MEETING - DICK G3WHR

We were very pleased to welcome Tony Gilbey G4YTG, who came to enlighten us on a new dimension in aerial design. Big - no, Enormous. After a brief recap on propagation, Tony stated that VLF signals required a vertical antenna. Quite simple, until you realise that the wavelength is approximately 50,000ft. With even a quarterwave somewhat impractical the solution was a loaded vertical with capacity hat.

Thus Tony revealed that at Rugby, the series of 820ft masts and 8ft diameter cages joining them, is just the Capacity Hat, approx: 54pf. All the radiation comes from a single vertical section, helped by a 16ft diameter litz wire loading coil and 80 miles of buried earth mat. Tony described some alternative forms of ULF antennas and a number of slides illustrated some rather specialised components, such as a 22ft long insulator to withstand 54 tons force. Our thanks to Tony for his no-maths presentation. A pity that even with TWELVE 820ft masts; there's no aerial gain!
