Did you see the report in the national press on 27th July?.

"A CRACKDOWN on radio pirates was announced by the Government yesterday.

And cheats operating without a licence were warned by Technology Minister Geoffrey Pattie "to put the matter right as soon as possible."

He said in a Commons Written Reply that the main task of the Radio Investigation Service will be to trace pirate broadcasters.

The service will still deal with reception problems — but from now on customers will have to pay a call-out charge of £21."
