NEXT MEETING - Three Members Recount Their Experiences.

We are sorry that the talk planned for the 5th July by Charlie Newton on the subject of Auroral Propagation did not materialise, however, at short notice three of our members have volunteered to give half-hour talks on subjects close to their hearts.

1. 50MHz AND WHAT CAN BE ACHIEVED - Les, G4CUT.

Being one of the original U.K. permit holders, Les has gained considerable experience on this most interesting band since its return for amateur use in February 1986.

In the beginning, commercial equipment was not readily available and the operating hours were very restricted but this did not deter Les from setting up a station and burning the midnight oil to make many worthwhile contacts.

Happily the work of Les and his compatriots has resulted in the general release of 'Six' and 'Four' to all classes of U.K. amateurs with the only remaining limitations being output power and horizontal polarization.

2. CONTESTS, AWARDS AND QSL's - Ela, G6HKM.

With six years of operating and seven log-books filled with thousands of contacts made on four bands, Ela can be said to have fully entered into the spirit of amateur radio.

Ela will describe how she keeps the paperwork under control for indexing, QSL cards, contest logs and the collecting of some treasured awards.

3. ANTENNAS FOR D.F. EVENTS - Paul, G0BTH.

For the uninitiated hunter, the finding of the antenna wire does not necessarily mean that you have found the hidden station! Paul will describe some of the variations (tricks) that hidden stations can provide to make the actual location of the hidden operator more challenging. Even for those members who are not into D.F., we are sure that you will find the anecdotes quite amusing.

NATIONAL FIELD DAY 1988 - Gwyn G4FKH.

Our event station 'G4CUT/P' was again erected at Howlett's Hall Farm. There had been a meeting of interested parties at G3WHR's QTH previously, to arrange the necessary hauling and administration chores.

The work began on Saturday morning at 9 a.m. Two tents were erected, one for operating, the other a NAFFI facility. Four aerials were put up using the clubs Telomast and suitably sited trees. We did run into one problem with the clubs 3 element yagi, the hardware to hold the thing together was missing. G4FKH and G3PMX departed in search of the missing items; they were not found. However, G3PMX kindly lent us a set and we were able, between showers, to complete the aerial installations. The rig and operating position was ready for 15:00 hrs, giving time to tune the aerials in conjunction with an ATU. The various ATU settings were noted, hopefully allowing quick QSY'ing during the contest.

The contest proper started at 16:00 hrs and lasted for 24 hrs. We seemed to do well right from the offset this year, using both 10M and 160M to the full. 10M and 160M giving double points. I started the contest for a couple of hours, then left it to the others in the group to continue throughout the night, returning to site at 06:00. Breakfast was provided by G3WHR and very welcome it was too. Various operators worked throughout the day. Our total number of contacts this year was 582, being higher than I can ever remember. This was due to the high standard of operating, good band conditions and not least of all the excellent work done by the loggers.

The 160M long wire and the dipole not in use, were taken down during the day, the rest of the equipment was dismantled and the site cleared by 17:00 on the Sunday.

All in all this was a very pleasant weekend, with I believe a good result. Thanks are due to all the loggers, operators and helpers that assisted during the weekend. THANK YOU!

LAST MONTHS MEETING - Roy G3PMX.

Before the main proceedings we welcomed Pete, N4BHB and his wife Annette from Georgia who were visiting Bill G4JUW. Pete requested that we all contributed to his video recording by each in turn announcing our name and callsign in front of the camera....!!

We then continued with the Constructors' Competition, each competitor introducing their entry with a short talk on its salient points:-

Gwyn, G4FKH had designed and constructed an unusual morse key which has two finger pads for the dots and dashes respectively. The pads actuate micro-switches which drive I.C.'s to process the timing of the resulting morse signal.

Martin, G4T00 had made a V.H.F. Antenna Tuning Unit to match his 2 metre rig to a G5RV antenna. A nicely constructed unit with an excellent paint finish.

Richard, G4ICP had adapted a scrapped commercial power supply into a 12 volt regulated unit for amateur radio application. The electronics were complete but the covers had yet to be made and fitted.

Ken, G6WHY had constructed a very nice linear amplifier for 23 centimetres complete with high voltage power supply. With only the minimum of assistance he had been able to fabricate the valve cavity and tuning mechanism; the whole assembly being mounted on a heavy duty chassis. Ken was not able to show it in action because of all the peripherals required but assured us that 40 watts of useful R.F. could be generated.

Finally, Dick, G3WHR showed us the skeleton 160 metre Aerial Tuning Unit that he had constructed for the "any situation" encountered when setting up the hidden station for D.F. events. With a selection of hook-clips it is possible to match any length of wire to the transmitter either by series or parallel tuning.

Having seen all these entries the meeting adjourned for tea while the judges, Roy and Phil, considered the merits of each and place them in order for the prize giving.
