MID-ESSEX TROPHY.

This two station event was held on Sunday 16th October, using the same rules that apply to RSGB National Qualifying events. There was a surprise element in this years contest in that it used the OS map 155 Bury St.Edmunds.

The start was at Nayland using a lay-by on the A134. Both stations were clearly heard and gave bearings of NW and E.

The 'A' station G4PQY/P was hidden alongside a footpath near Lavenham. Here Alan Williams had used a fishing rod and weighted line to get the aerial high up through nearby trees. This, coupled with a really wet earth (he was sitting on a fallen tree over a stream) gave a very strong signal at the start. The proximity of a nearby wood and old railway track caused some teams to take a new long route into the station.

The 'B' station G3WMM/P was well concealed in a wood by the A12 at East Bergholt. Mike Hawkins had arranged a near invisible aerial to run along the line of a wire fence. Several teams spent a long time here, having first thoroughly investigated a rather more visible dummy aerial.

Afterwards we were all invited to Mike and Pat Hawkins home for our Bring-a-Bite tea, where stories of success and disaster were told, and where Philip Cunningham became the new custodian of the Mid-Essex Trophy. Results below showing position and arrival times,
