

#### **Club Nets**

CARS meets for talks/events on the first Tuesday of the month. The subsequent Tuesdays have club radio nets as follows below and dates listed on our calendar at <a href="https://www.g0mwt.org.uk/main/events/categories/net/">www.g0mwt.org.uk/main/events/categories/net/</a>:-

#### • 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday in the Month – VHF

The CARS VHF FM Net uses GB3DA from Danbury starting at 8pm (local). GB3DA is 145.125MHz Input and 145.725MHz Output - and CTCSS-only (110.9Hz), 2min timeout If for any reason GB3DA is not available then 145.375 Simplex will be used. Vertical aerials are best for this

## • 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday in the Month - UHF

The CARS UHF FM Net uses GB3ER from Danbury and starting at 8pm (local). GB3ER is 434.675MHz Input and 433.075MHz Output - and is CTCSS-only Vertical aerials are best.

#### 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday in the Month - HF

The CARS 80m Net on "3756kHz" Night, SSB and starting at 8pm (local). Horizontal aerials are best. The idea is to enable distant CARS Members to join the Net.

5<sup>th</sup> Tuesday in the Month (when there is one!) - MF

This is the CARS Top Band Net on 1947/1950 kHz +/-QRM, LSB and starting at 8pm (local). Horizontal aerials are usually used for this Net. A reminder - limit your power to a max of 30 Watts, please.

## July Meeting: An Introduction to RAYNET

At the July Danbury meeting, Andy Atkinson M0IXY presented a nicely illustrated introduction and overview of Essex RAYNET.

As many will be aware the origins of the story go back to the East Coast Floods of 31<sup>st</sup> January 1953. This prompted the formation of the Radio Amateur Emergency Network in March 1954. In 2017 the independent and RSGB-affiliated groups came



together and formed the RAYNET-UK national organisation, which provides administrative support to local groups, of which Essex RAYNET is in Zone-4

The current UK legal framework is the 2004 Civil Contingencies Act and is referenced in the Ofcom amateur licence along with the term 'User Services'.

Essex RAYNET has a role in the Essex Resilience Plan for providing emergency communications to Category 1 and 2 user services. In practice a more common request is to provide comms support for charities and communities events such as runs, cycling, car rallies, Clacton air show etc.

Currently Essex RAYNET has a membership of ~36 and assets across Essex including its own repeater network, use of APRS etc. There are also regular exercises with User Services including testing procedures and interoperability.

In concluding, Andy summarised some of the features of RAYNET activities:


- No event is the same
- Using skills and making a personal contribution to supporting charities
- Working closely with other voluntary and professional organisations
- Being part of the contingency planning for Essex County Planning and Resilience

The provisional table layout in the main hall is in the diagram >>


