Operating Portable By Charlie Davy, M0PZT

We're all hoping for a good summer in 2015, which is the perfect excuse to get out in the fresh air and 'play radio'. With that in mind, the subject of the CARS May club night was "Operating Operable".



Around 50 people turned out to hear experienced /P operator Charlie, MOPZT discuss working in the field, and the talk had a good mix of content for those new to the world of portable operating, as well as those with more experience.

After running through the 'The Big Three' of working portable "Why? Where? and How?, Charlie talked through the challenges experienced when working away from the cosy environment of the home shack, such as equipment, antennas, batteries, and catering.

A good selection of equipment was brought along by Charlie, as well as fellow portable operators Peter, G0DZB and Pete, M0PSX. Charlie gets to most events using pedal-power, so what he brings along is restricted. He typically relies on a sealed lead acid battery (SLAB) for power, and there was some interesting discussion on lighter LiPo batteries, with an appropriate warning that they do require careful handling. Safety was another important topic covered during the talk, with recommendations including the use of yellow guy wires, pegs and Velcro, plus careful and secure erection of antennas.



If you fancy trying your handy at some portable work this summer, Charlie and the team expect to be very active at sites including Galleywood Common, Maldon Park and Shoebury East Beach. Updates on last minute field days will typically be announced on the @m0pzt or @essexham Twitter feeds, so keep an eye out. These events are a great opportunity to either bring out your own kit to give it a try, get help from others, or try something new on someone else's equipment or antenna.

Well done to Charlie MOPZT for putting together an excellent talk and passing on some top tips.

STEM Initiative Marconi – Hall Street Factory

The UK government is trying to encourage young people to take an interest in science and engineering. Here in Essex @BackTheBid2MT seeks to raise money to 'save' the world's first wireless factory, in Hall Street, Chelmsford. Hall Street was opened by Marconi in 1899 and was replaced by a much bigger complex at New Street after Titanic sunk in 1912.

Its legacy is that thousands and thousands of lives were saved, not just on Titanic and Lusitania thanks to equipment made at that tiny building – which is now on the brink of becoming flats and business space, just like New Street, but on a smaller scale.

International Marconi Day - Sandford Mill

Commemorating Marconi's Birthday - 25th April 1874 Sat 25-Apr-2015, 10am - 5pm

The day started a little wet but that did not dampen the spirits of CARS members who undertook a wide range of activities at Sandford Mill as part of the 2015 International Marconi Day on Saturday 25th April.



The club callsign GX0MWT was operated as an official 'Award Station' in the historic "Marconi Hut" making many contacts on 40M throughout the world, and a CW only station in the upper office where Andy Kersey G0IBN and his team were in attendance.



On the first floor Colin Page, G0TRM and his team was demonstrating the impressive Morse Key display with the opportunity for the youngsters to try their hand. The Morse punched paper tape sending and decoding process always proves to be a big hit with potential junior CW operators.

During the day there were several presentations in the Barn on the museum site. At 2:15 pm radio communications historian Dr Elizabeth Bruton, gave a talk on Marconi. This included details about the vital wartime contribution made by the Marconi Company during World War One. It also included a local element: a signals interception station located at the Hall Street works in Chelmsford.

With over 400 visitors to Sandford Mill and the Radio Stations, this was a very successful day for the Society.

CARS Vice President John Bowen, G8DET gave three presentations titled "Saving Lives at Sea up to and including the RMS <u>Lusitania</u>" from 11am throughout the day.



The centenary of the May-7 Lusitania sinking was also featured in a <u>separate special event</u>, where a CW only radio station was in use.

Many thanks to all that helped from the society to make the day a success, from the operators who took part on the key or the mic to those who hosted explaining Amateur Radio to the public as the enjoyed the day.
